



2021 Project Focus: Ilynn Haven Park

2021 presented the Communities of Coastal Georgia Foundation with ample opportunities to

help "solve problems" that were challenging our region. One of the most notable was a challenge faced by the Glynn Haven neighborhood in the mid-island area of Saint Simons. Though the densest neighborhood on the Island, with more children than any other neighborhood,

Glynn Haven residents did not have direct access to a park. What they did have was a oneacre lot that, until 2016, had been the site of a church that was razed without a permit. During the ensuing five years, Glynn Haven children utilized this lot as an active play space.

In 2021, the lot was slated for a multi-house development. Neighbors were not pleased with the plan to eliminate their

children's' play space and to increase the density of their neighborhood. Through conversations with the developers and county commissioners, Glynn Haven leaders began to explore their options. With the incredible help of our county commissioners, a committee was established which included the Foundation to work together to negotiate a purchase price for the empty lot. The committee then collaborated with the community to secure the support of Sea Island, Golden Isles Fund for Trees, 100 Women Who Care, and other impactful businesses and individuals to raise the necessary funds to convert it into a park. With \$200,000 needed, the community faced a challenge;



how could supporters make tax deductible donations to fund the Glynn Haven Park effort? This is where the Communities of Coastal Georgia Foundation was able to step in and fulfill this need.

By establishing a fund at the Foundation, they were able to raise the required funds from neighbors making individual gifts, local foundations, and even children

> conducting a neighborhood bake sale. 488 donations, ranging in size from \$25,000 all the way down to \$2, covered the required commitment within a very tight timeline and led to the purchase of the land by Glynn County.

"The whole neighborhood is so excited to see the progress that has been made in the park. To go from an empty space slated for construction to groundbreaking with new trees

in a county park in under a year is simply amazing." says Glynn Haven neighbor Patti Downs.

"We were thrilled to be a part of this project and are counting the days until we see children on the playground and families enjoying the green space. We are delighted to know many generations will enjoy this space for years to come." said Glynn Haven neighbor Greer Anderson. Problem solved.

In Memorian

ALSTON DAYTON "PETE" CORRELL – APRIL 28, 1941-MAY 25, 2021 The Communities of Coastal Georgia Foundation lost one of its passionate supporters in 2021 when A.D. "Pete" Correll passed away on May 25. He was 80.

Pete was well known for his philanthropy and his love for the Golden Isles, where he was born and raised. He served as CEO of Georgia-Pacific Corporation for 13 years, where he led one of the nation's largest organizations.

Along the way, Pete gave his time and money to local causes and organizations. His impacts are evident at places like College of Coastal Georgia, where he and his surviving wife Ada Lee funded the construction of the Correll Center for Teacher Education and Learning. The couple also funded the construction of the Boys and Girls Club of Southeast Georgia's Elizabeth F. Correll Teen Center in honor of his late mother.

Pete was also instrumental in supporting the St. Simons Land Trust's preservation of Cannon's Point Nature Preserve on the north end of St. Simons Island. He also gave through and supported the Communities of Coastal Georgia Foundation.



The Corrells endowed a needs-based scholarship program at the University of Georgia and were key players in saving Grady Memorial Hospital in Atlanta by leading a \$325 million fundraising campaign.

The Communities of Coastal Georgia Foundation family will miss Pete's contributions, his undying passion for philanthropy and his passion for the Golden Isles.

MARTHA BRUMLEY ELLIS - APRIL 10, 1937-JULY 4, 2021



The Communities of Coastal Georgia Foundation said goodbye to one of its first supporters and friends on July 4, 2021, when Martha Brumley Ellis died at the age of 84. Martha grew up in St. Marys and had lived for decades in the Golden Isles. Martha had a giving heart and, along with her family, impacted numerous causes and organizations throughout Georgia. She was a founding board member for the Communities of Coastal Georgia Foundation and served for the maximum of three terms, from 2005 to 2014.

She combined efforts with a group of friends to start a local women's giving circle, Golden Isles ACT, to provide targeted philanthropy. Martha also opened her home to many parties-for-a-purpose on Sea Island.

Statewide, Martha gave generously to one of her favorite causes, the State Botanical Gardens in Athens. There she devoted considerable energy to the Children's Garden and other endeavors.

Martha's generous spirit and passion for giving will be missed at the Communities of Coastal Georgia Foundation. Thanks to her efforts, we are here today to serve Coastal Georgia.
